- The MA program in Addiction Studies (then Addictionology) has been approved by the MU council, *February 18, 2004*.
- It is the *first* Addiction Studies MA degree program in Thailand and the Asia-Pacific region









Academic System

This program is a semester system. The number of credits assigned to each subject is determined as

follows :

1. A lecture or discussion course consuming 15 hours per semester is equivalent to 1 credit hour.

2. Laboratory work or practice consuming 30 hours per semester is equivalent to 1 credit hour.

3. **Training practice** consuming 45 hours per semester is equivalent to 1 credit hour.

4. A thesis consuming 45 hours per semester is equivalent to 1 credit hour.









Duration of Study

The overall study time through the curriculum should be a minimum of 1 academic years and a maximum of 5 academic years.









Registration

 Students must register on a full-time basis.
 Students must register for 15 credits per regular semester, or credit hours as advised or approved and recommended by the advisors and/or the executive board of the program.









Evaluation and Graduation Requirements 1. Evaluation

The academic performance shall be evaluated according to the relevant rules and regulations of Mahidol University.

2. Graduation Requirements

To be eligible for graduation, the students must:

2.1 have registered for the required minimum course credits in the program totaling 24 credits, plus 12 credits for the thesis. The overall credits required must not be less than 36, with a minimum GPA of 3.00.

2.2 have passed the English Proficiency Examination arranged by the Faculty of Graduate Studies, Mahidol University or have taken a TOEFL examination, obtaining a score of 500 or more.

2.3 have completed the thesis research and passed the oral thesis examination required for graduation according to the regulations of the Faculty of Graduate Studies, Mahidol University




